This may look a big increase but it was generally agreed that the IWA is very good value for money. We are not a profit making concern and with the exception of last year's "Lore and Lure" Show, we are not a charitable fund raising organisation either. We are a group established to promote understanding and friendship between our members through cross cultural exchange. Therefore, the money is used solely for those necessary expenses - eg., printing costs, and although nearly all our guest speakers and performers gave their services free, we must meet any expenses incurred by them on our behalf. We are fortunate, indeed, to receive so much generosity and goodwill from members and non-members alike.

This increase in subscription fees means that we will cease making a charge for "Music and Performing Arts" and "Cooking Swapshop". Don't worry about your coupons though, we shall still be collecting them for special events like Diwali Mela when we cannot cover all the expenses from out budget alone. We shall also be introducing (From June) a Rs 5/= charge for guests - be they husbands/mothers/daughters or houseguests.

Remember that your subscription becomes better value the more active you are, and the more meetings you attend.

We, the Committee, hope that we are giving you the best possible service and value for money but we do rely upon you to give us idear and, if you have any constructive ciriticisms, then we need to know these also. Please write and tell us because if you don't, then we don't know about them.

Finally we have arranged the AGM for Monday 10th April at the Music Academy mini hall so we look forward to seeing as. my of you as possible there.



Guide Lines for an Active Member.

Now that yet another eventful I.W.A. year is coming to an end, we thought it is time to clear certain misconceptions in the minds of few of our members and also to acquaint the new members of the basic norms we follow in I.W.A. As our President Barbara Clarkson succintly put it - "The I W A is your organisation and it upto us members to keep it dynamic and that can only be done if there is active participation of our members". The eleven months of the I.W.A year is normally packed with meetings barring December and January which are lean months with a reason. Roughly speaking the other nine months, we do have nearly eight meetings per month which brings the total to 72 meetings through the year. To answer the oft repeated query, who is an active member?

- (1) An active member is one who can attend 10 meetings in a year. That should not be difficult for out of 72 meetings surely you can attend 10!
- (2) An active member is one who can host a meeting. Here, we would like to remind members of the decision taken on 2nd February at the extraordinary general meeting when it was decided that a hostess should serve only one item (be it a cookie or a sandwich) along with coffee and tea. The stress should be on the meeting and not the eating. If in her enthusiasm the hostess provides a second item we will have to send it back to her kitchen. So we appeal to our hostesses to just stick to one item only and help us to keep the discipline.

- An active member is one who can share her talents with us. There is no doubt that there is a wealth of untapped talent among the members. Please do not be bashful. Do come forward and offer us programmes which you can present. There may be amongst you a good speaker; a melodious singer or accomplished musician who can play an instrument or one who is a gifted dancer, or one of you may excel in gourmet cooking. Whatever you can do that we are not aware of please contact any of the activity chairpersons who can take advantage of your special skills. That is active participation.
- (4) An active member is one who can help us organise meetings either by suggesting a speaker or getting him or her to speak to us; or also helping us find a venue.

We are very happy to note that two of our inactive members are coming all the way from Bombay to give us two special meetings in March which is most laudable indeed.

We would also like to enumerate a few norms to follow when coming to meetings.

We have come to the conclusion that an R.S.V.P. is a must more especially to help the hostess. She needs to know whether she would have to get 20 chairs or 40 chairs. She needs also to know while catering for coffee. If you have given your name and cannot make it in the last minute, please call up and cancel your name. This is a basic courtesy which we owe to our hostess. If you have not given your name previously but would like to go in the last minute - please do not

hesitate to call the hoatess and go along. The I.W.A is an organisation to promote mutual friendships, so we welcome you to all meetings - only do let us know to ensure commofortable seating.

If you come to a meeting and find that you have to leave early - do find a seat near the exit, so that your exit can be unobstrusive.

If you have questions to ask plese wait till the end of the talk and then fire away your questions. A speaker will not appreciate his line of thought being disturbed by a barrage of questions.

If you have your pet charity and wish to seek the help of our members - please request the Activity chairperson concerned to make an announcement on your behalf. Those who wish to help the said charity can aproach you to buy the cards. Please do not foist cards on unsuspecting members and lose your goodwill in the process.

Whatever criticism you may have be it constructive or destructive - you have two of the most approachable members as your presidents in Barbara and Vanitha. Please write to them for genuine grievances or clarifications. The two vice presidents are also there at your service and one of them is the Founder Past President of I.W.A.

And now to the most perennial and recurring complaiant - you have not get your newletter. Believe us - we have streamlined the system thoroughly and names and address are checked and double checked. If you still are not getting it - blame it on your own postal division, so please take it up with the postal authorities Do not blame us!
