PALAPPAM (HOPPERS)

INGREDIENTS:

4 Cups Rice Flour

1 Large Coconut

1 Teaspoon Salt

1 Tablespoon Rava

1 Cup Water

1 Level Teaspoon Yeast

2 Teaspoon Sugar

1 Cup Luke warm water

METHOD:

- Mix sugar and yeast and pour warm water and stir till it dissolves. Keep aside until a froth appears.
- 2. Make a porridge with rava and water. Keep aside.
- 3. Sieve the flour into a basin. Pour the yeast mixture, the porridge and water and kneed into a soft dough for atleast 10 minutes, folding it several times until it is soft to touch. Keep the dough aside for 5 to 6 hours.
- Extract the milk from the coconut. Add to the dough with salt and sugar and make a thin batter without any lumps. Leave the batter for three hours or more.
- Heat a Kadai, rub with oil or ghee and pour one big spoon of better and spread by rotating it. Rotate only once. Cover with a tight fitting lid with a handle. Cook for about three minutes.
