## FESTIVALS OF THE MONTH

## Sri Rama Navami - April 15th

This is a day celebrating the birth of Sri Rama, one of the avatars of Vishnu, and is observed in homes and temples with great piety, chanting of prayers, and singing of ballads. Repeating Ramanama on this day is believed to give great spiritual strength.

## Bakr-Id - April 18th

This festival is of great importance in Islam, as it celebrates the sacrifice of Prophet Hazrat Ibrahim. To test his faith, God asked him to sacrifice his son Ishmael to which he willingly agreed, so great was his faith and trust in God. He blindfolded himself and killed his son, but when he opened his eyes, he found his son alive and a slain ram in his place. To celebrate this event, Muslims sacrifice (if possible) one animal per family, a goat, sheep or camel. Men attend mass prayers in mosques and distribute alms to the poor. New clothes are worn and greetings exchanged.

## Mahavir Jayanthi - April 20th

This day commemmorates the birth anniversary of Mahavira, the founder of Jainism, a highly ascetic religion which places great emphasis on Ahimsa or non-violence. It is a day of prayer and celebration in all Jain temples and homes.




#### TAROT CARDS
