Have you forgotten your mind? - that ceaseless wanderer and creator of desires and everyday dramas. Is this mind, seldom understood and harnessed, a power by itself or is it something that can be yoked, guided and brought to align with a larger purpose and journey in life? We take care of our bodies, our homes, offices and even our environment, but do we take enough care of our minds? We allow it to run wild here and there and collect a lot of irrelevant experiences and influences that we find difficult to free ourselves from later.

In this talk, the eternal relevance of thought direction, of ceaseless awareness of oneself and how these exercises can be pleasurable rather than irksome are explained. For this we need to understand the nature of the mind and learn how it can be made a friend of rather than an enemy. The talk will describe two simple forms of contemplation to rid ourselves of sorrow and stress.

Terrorism

Terrorism is hard to ignore. Almost everyday television news, newspapers, magazines run and re-run pictures of dramatic acts of violence carried out by ferocious looking terrorists or claimed by shadowy militant groups. It is often hard not to be scared when we see people like us killed or maimed by terrorist attacks at fast food restuarants, in office buildings, on public buses and trains or along normal looking streets.

So, what is terrorism? What do we mean when we use the term? Is one man's terrorist another man's freedom fighter? Is terrorsim new, a kind of asymmetrical warfare just invented at the beginning of 21st century? Or, does terrorism have a long history stretching back over centuries? Does it ever end?

Dr.Geetha Madhavan, a Chennai based lawyer, is a Phd. in International Law from the University of Madras is the first woman in Asia to be awarded a doctorate for her research on International Terrorism by the Hague Academy of International Law. Dr. Madhavan's talk will cover the above aspects.

HISTORY, CULTURE AND TOURS

KARNATAKA & GOA



February 2011, we plan a trip to Karnataka and Goa. Karnataka is blessed with time-less temples, pristine beaches, world heritage sites, spectacular waterfalls.

Goa is one state which plunges you into a world of azure water, glistening sand and beaches, old churches and much more.

In Karnataka we plan to visit:

- SHARAVANABELOGOLA an important Jaina centre to see the world's largest mono-lithic statue (57 feet) of Sri Bahubali.
- BELUR The main attractions here being the Cheenakeshwara temple which is a marvellous specimen of Hoysala architecture.
- HALEBEEDU meaning 'City of Ruins', again famous for Hoyaleswara Temple carved out of soapstone which took 105 years to complete and has innumerable figures carved on the walls. It is considered a 'Gem of Indian Architecture'.
- UDIPI the Konkani city which lends its name to the Kannada vegetarian cuisine and is famous for its Krishna Mutt.
- KOLLUR Mookambika temple an ancine temple situated at the banks of the never drying river Samparnika dedicated to Goddess Paravathi.
- Jog Falls created by the Sharavathi River is the highest plunge waterfalls in India.
- MURUDESHWARA- built on the Kanduka hill surrounded by Arabian Sea is dedicated to Lord Shiva and has the tallest 20 storied gopura in the world.
- GOKARNA famous for its beautiful beaches and landscapes, specially Ohm beach which is shaped like the Ohm symbol.

We end our trip in GOA, where we will visit the Bom Jesus Basilica, (which holds the mortal remains of St. Francis Xavier) and Se Cathedral, Dona Paula and beaches of Anjana, Varca. We will also visit the temples and the flea market.

Terms and conditions:

COST per person is Rs.31,000/- (twin sharing) and Rs.39,000/- (single).

DURATION: 7N/8D (including 1 night in the train)

DATE OF TRAVEL: 20th Feb. to 27th Feb.

GROUP SIZE: 23 minimum, 32 maximum

TRANSFERS: We travel to Mysore by the overnight train. Mysore to Goa by AC coach, Goa to Chennai by air.

THE ABOVE RATES INCLUDE:

2 nights at Hassan(Hotel Hoysala village), 1 night at Udipi(at Paradise Isle Beach Resort),1 at Gokarna (Om beach Resort) and 2 nights at Goa (at Bambolin Beach Resort). 7 breakfasts, lunches and dinner. Tips, taxis, tour leader, guide at Belur, Halebeedu are also included.

Does not include personal expenses, laundry, telephone, etc.

IMPORTANT: Since we plan to fly back and the airfare keeps increasing, people who warn in have to pay up Rs.10,000/ IMMEDIATELY as we need to block the seats. Also the air fare keeps increasing every 3 days so it is better to get the tickets as soon as possible.
