My soul can reach, when feeling out of sight
For the ends of Being and ideal Grace.
I love thee to the level of everyday's
Most quiet need, by sun and candle-light.
I love thee freely, as men strive for Right;
I love thee purely, as they turn from Praise.
I love thee with the passion put to use
In my old griefs, and with my childhood's faith.
I love thee with a love I seemed to lose
With my lost saints, —I love thee with the breath,
Smiles, tears, of all my life!—- and, if God choose,
I shall but love thee better after death.



Love Heart shaped cookies recipe

These heart-shaped shortbread cookies are light, buttery and topped with royal icing. They are perfect to make for Valentine's Day!

Ingredients:

- 1 1/2 cups castor sugar
- 1 cup unsalted butter
- 1 large egg
- 2 tsp vanilla extract
- 2 1/2 cups plain flour
- 1 tsp baking powder
- 1/2 tsp salt

Icing glaze

- 2 1/4 cups icing sugar, sifted
- 2 tbsp glucose syrup
- 2 tbsp milk
- Food colouring of your choice

Method:

Using an electric mixer, cream butter and sugar in a bowl until light and fluffy.

Beat in egg and vanilla. Add flour, baking powder and salt. Mix to combine.

Divide dough in half and gather into balls. Flatten them to disks and cover in cling film. Refrigerate for 1 hour.

Preheat oven to 190°C. Line a baking sheet with baking paper and set aside.

On a floured work surface, roll dough to $1/2\ cm$ thickness and cut with a heart-shaped cookie cutter.

Place on the tray and bake for 13 minutes or until pale golden.

Transfer cookies to racks to cool. Mix cookie glaze ingredients together and colour to your liking. Cover cookies with the glaze.
