



In the South the 10 days of Navarathri is celebrated with KOLU - a dolls' festival.



Kalamkari is a form of painting fabrics with vegetable colours. It derives its name from the Kalam or pen made of bamboo with which the artist draws out intricate designs and then fills in the colours.

There are several important centres of Kalamkari, of which Srikalahasti in Andhra Predesh retains teh most original designs and methods. To enable members of IWA to learn this craft, two craftsmen, one of whom is a National Award Winner and Master Craftsman, will be spending two weeks in Madras. The fee for the course if Rs.200/-including the cloth, herbs and pen.

#### RECIPE OF SEPTEMBER

TEMPURA



#### INGREDIENTS

1 egg

1/2 cup ice wate

1 cup sifted flour

150 gms each seafood, Vegetables per person

Grated white radish Grated ginger

#### METHOD

#### 1. Prepare seafood and vegetables :

Prawn ... Cut off heads, devein and ramove shell

leaving tails attached.

Squid ... Cut into 2 X 1 inches rectangle

Onion ... Choose small size. Slice them not too

thin

Carrot ... Slice into fine strips

Capacicum ... Remove seeds and cut into 2 inches square.

2. Make the batter just before cooking :

Break egg into well chilled bowl; edd iced water. Add sifted flour. Make lumpy batter. Never mix well.

- 3. Heat oil to 330 355 deg.F. depending on ingredient.
- 4. Cost ingredients with batter, starting with vegetables. Slide into hot oil and deep-fry until golden turning once or twice for even cooking.
- Drain excess oil on paper-lined plate or tray after deepfrying.
