




# HISTORY, CULTURE & TOURS

has published several papers. He revived the annual art festival at Chidambaram and has done major work in Indian archaeology and epigraphy.



Sri Mohan from Yoga Mandiram, a devoted disciple of the great Acharya will be present to give us expert advice and answer your questions.



All are welcome.


