# DEMONSTRATION OF CHINESE STIR FRIED COOKING

CHAO or Stir Frying cooking is the most widely known method of Chinese and Far Eastern Cooking. It involves cooking various ingredients of the dish together for a short time using a small amount of oil over high heat in a WOK. This helps in retaining a large percentage of nutrients otherwise lost by overcooking by other methods, at the same time the natural flavour and taste of the ingredients are also retained.

Chef Rubynath of the Taj Coromandel will demonstrate stir frying cooking with the following combinations :

- 1. Stir fried peas with brown bean sauce.
- 2. Stir fried chicken with walnut.
- 3. Stir fried steak and onions.
