THE NATIONAL FAMILY HEALTH SURVEY OF EVER-MARRIED WOMEN AGE 13-49 IN INDIA:

The NFHS covered the population of 24 states in India and the National Capital territory of Delhi to provide a source of demographic and health data for Inter-State comparisons. The primary objectives of the NFHS was to provide National level and State level data on fertility, nuptiality, the potential demand for contraception, child nutrition and health.

Sandra Rowland who has edited all of the reports from the survey, will describe some of the key findings with emphasis on Tamil Nadu.



KATHAK - A Rhythm oriented dance form

PRASHANT SHAH, an accomplished Kathak artiste is a disciple of Kumudini Lakhia renowned Kathak guru of Kadamb, Ahmedabad. Prashant has travelled and performed extensively abroad and in India. His style comprises of virtuosity and aesthetic sense.

Prevalent as the classical dance form of North India, Kathak has a long history which has been traced back over 2,000 years. Its development into the form known today has been a gradual process, cultivated through a rich mixture of Hindu and Islamic influences. Nurtured in the holy precincts of the Hindu temple Kathak has attained refinement and enriched itself with various hues and embellishments.

Kathak means story teller, and it developed as a dance form in which a solo dancer tells and interprets stories from mythology. In nritya, one type of expressional item is called gats, danced by delicate glances of the eye and by using the art of mime. Themes from life are taken. Also, in items which have accompanying lyrics, expressions are shown evoking the rasa or emotion which is inspired in the audience.

The themes of Krishna, Radha, Shiva, Parvati and mythological characters find prominent place in the Kathak dancer's repertoire. Nowadays, experiments are being carried out with group choreography exploring the dance form. Both men and women perform Kathak which is also used to present dance dramas of historical tales and contemporary events.

All are welcome for this scintillating performance.





IN MARCH 1988, WHEN IWA WAS IN ITS SECOND YEAR, THE TWO FOUNDER PRESIDENTS NIRMAL SESHADRI AND NANCY DEAN AND THEIR BOARD PRESENTED IWA'S FIRST ANNUAL EVENT - A COSTUME SHOW BASED ON THE JEWELS AND TEXTILES OF INDIA. EVERY PARTICIPANT, BOTH ON THE STAGE AND BEHIND THE SCENE, WAS AN IWA MEMBER AND THE SHOW WAS AN OUTSTANDING SUCCESS. IT WAS THEN THAT ONE OF THE PAST PRESIDENTS, NIRMAL MIRZA, CONCEIVED THIS MOST BRILLIANT IDEA THAT AT EVERY ANNUAL EVENT IWA SHOULD GIVE A 'WOMAN OF THE YEAR' AWARD TO AN OUTSTANDING WOMAN IN TAMIL NADU - CHOSEN FROM VARIED FIELDS. NIRMAL MIRZA ALSO SAID THAT HER COMPANY, WOOLTOP WEAVES, WOULD SPONSOR THE AWARD.

ALTHOUGH IN THE EARLY YEARS IWA HELD THIS EVENT ONLY ON ALTERNATE YEARS, WITH EACH SUCCESSIVE YEAR, IWA GREW IN STRENGTH, TODAY NIRMAL MIRZA'S BRAINCHILD HAS BECOME AN ANNUAL EVENT HELD SEPARATELY. Subbulakshmi, Mrs. Qudsia Gandhi, Mrs. Sheela Rani Chunkath, Mrs. Sarojini Varadappan and Mrs. Gita Ram have been the recipients of this Award in the past.

IWA's Past-President, Nirmal Mirza, instituted the Award and will sponsor it this year also through her handloom export firm Wooltop Weaves.

This year, the Category chosen is the field of Education in India. Our members voted for Mrs. Tara Sathyanarayana, well known for her deep commitment and involvement in this field.

Tara Sathyanarayana has been an eminent educationist of Madras for the past several years. She joined Vidya Mandir as a teacher in 1956, became its Principal in 1964 and retired in 1988, when she became the Correspondent of Vidya Mandir, Mylapore and Vidya Mandir, Adyar, which she started. Today, she is the Correspondent of Vidya Mandir, Adyar. Her life has been dedicated to education.

Apart from her own career as an academician and Principal, what distinguishes and makes her a great educationist is the fact that she has emphasised the importance of an all-round education as being more important than marks and ranks.

She believes in training the child to cope with the outside world and has encouraged children to take up responsibilities so that they may become confident members of society. Her guiding motto is that the child is the most important person and the school programme must encourage him/her.

She has worked to make the school a social institution where children can be happy, so that they can grow up with happy memories of their childhood and become confident adults.

Children who have had problems in learning, in their psychological make-up and in other areas were cared for by Mrs. Tara Sathyanarayana who has made it possible for those children to complete school, graduate and do well in life.
