VISIT TO THE SOS CHILDREN'S VILLAGE

The concept of the SOS Children's Village was born out of the devastation of the Second World War. Dr. Hermann Gmeiner, an Austrian doctor, was deeply moved by the plight of hundreds of refugee children wandering without home or parents over the ruins of Europe. He took some of the children into his home and started an international phenomenon. Today there are over 316 SOS Children's Villages spread over the world.

The SOS Village in Tambaram was started by UMA NARAYANAN, a recipient of IWA's "Woman of the Year" Award for 1990.

We will meet at the SOS Village at 10.30 am and return by 1.00 pm. Those who wish to proceed directly may do so; others will meet at the C.P. Art Centre by 9.00 am and leave by 9.15 am.
