





### THE LAST SPRING - ABRAHAM ERALY

The Last Spring, the first of a series of four books Abraham Eraly plans to write on India, is a fascinating reconstruction of the Mughal era portraying life rather than attempting to merely chronical history. Eraly has quoted extensively from Mughal chronicals giving immediacy and authenticity to the narrative. The book goes a long way in correcting the misconstrued popular image of the Mughal rulers as being tyrannical and unabashedly Islamic. The author also brings alive several historical figures like Babar, the adventurous Akbar and the impulsive Humayun.

Abraham Eraly who will review his own book with us, taught history for several years at Madras Christian College and for a couple of years in the U.S. From 1977 to 1992 he edited the well-known Chennai magazine, "ASIDE".

The book is available at all leading book stores and libraries.


