From the days when Sudha Raghunathan took part in the college competitions, her musical genius and appeal have taken the Madras audience by storm. Trained in Carnatic music by none other than the expert, M.L. Vasanthakumari, Sudha has accompanied her in several concerts both in India and abroad. Today, Sudha is a household name, whose charisma and command of music draws a large audience to her concerts.

She is a Post Graduate in Economics and has the distinction of having been judged the Most Outstanding Student of the Ethiraj College, Madras for three years in succession. She has won more than 200 prizes in musical competitions and several titles have been conferred on her. Well known amongst which are Sangeetha Choodamani, Kalaimamani, For the Sake of Honour Award and Isai Peroli. She has been selected as one of the 10 Outstanding Young Indians and has been nominated for the Outstanding Persons of the World Award. Sudha has had the unique privilege of having performed at the Theatre de la Ville, Paris and the Lincoln Centre, New York and also in Europe, South Africa, U.S.A., U.K., Canada, Far East, Australia and New Zealand.

Closer home, the audience loved Sudha as the compere of the Millennium Concert at Madras. Recently she has launched a Trust, Samudhaaya Foundation, for Social Welfare Activities under whose banner Sudha's benefit performance for the Kargil Relief Fund raised Rs. 5 lakhs.

WOMAN OF THE YEAR AND GIRL CHILD OF THE YEAR AWARDS

The presentation of these two awards is a major event in IWA. Each year the category or area of work for the awards varies.

The Woman of the Year Award, instituted by Past President Nirmal Mirza has been presented to committed and outstanding women who have been selected from the varying fields of the arts and crafts, medicine, social work, education and biotechnology. This year the award is being presented to one who has created awareness and change through the might of her pen. The Woman of the Year Award, 1999-2000, is being awarded to Ms. Sivasankari, whose writings in Tamil have addressed the social evils of the day and spread awareness and understanding of the same. Sivasankari's works have been widely translated into other languages and also been adapted for the television.

The criteria for the selection of the Girl Child of the Year, instituted by Dr. Prithika Chary in 1997, has been for one who has in spite of severe health disorders proved to be an achiever. Children with Downs Syndrone and renal failure have been selected for the award earlier and this year's awardee has been chosen for cardiac disorder. The Girl Child of the Year Award, 1999 - 2000, is being awarded to Miss Suthasini, who has battled with both a congenital heart problem and deafness and is now preparing for her Std X examination.

Some of the earlier recipients of the Awards will also be present at the function.
