WOMEN OF THE MILLENNIUM - VALENTINA TERESHKOVA, THE FIRST WOMAN IN SPACE

Tereshkova, Valentina Vladimirova, born in 1937, became the first woman to travel in space. In the spacecraft Vostok VI, Tereshkova made 45 revolutions around the earth in a 70-hour and 50-minute flight from June 16 to 19, 1963. Soviet cosmonaut Valery F.Bykovsky was launched almost two days before Terekshova. The two spacecraft came within 5 kilometres of each other during the flight. Soviet officials said the dual flight was conducted for "simultaneous observation of the reactions of a man and woman flying in space." Tereshkova orbited the earth once every 88 minutes during her historic journey and parachuted from Vostok VI after reentering the earth's atmosphere.

Tereshkova was the first space traveller with no previous experience as a test pilot. She became interested in parachuting as a hobby, and made more than 125 jumps before volunteering for space flight training school. At the school, Tereshkova also received training as an aeroplane pilot. Tereshkova became an active member of the Young Communist League. In November 1963, she married cosmonaut Andrian Nikolayev.

"Kanam Vittum Onam Unnanam"




