GAYATRI BEWOOR CHANDRIKA CHIDAMBARAM

WOMEN OF THE MILLENIUM - MARIA MITCHELL, FIRST WOMAN ASTRONOMER

Born in 1818, in Nantucket, Massachusetts, Maria was the third child of a Quaker family with ten children. She attended Cyrus Pierce's School for Young Ladies and for a time was taught by her father, but was largely self-educated. Few women have been able to break through prejudice and stereotype to become noted scientisits the way Maria did. On October 1, 1847 Maria Mitchell discovered a telescopic comet, an accomplishment for which she received a gold medal from King Frederick of Denmark. She was the first woman admitted to the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, as well as the American Philosophical Society. She was a professor of astronomy at Vassar and had a crater on the moon named for her. She led the 1875 Women's Congress. She died in 1889 in Lynn, Massachusetts. Posthumously, a tablet with her name was put up in the New York University Hall of Fame, her name was carved in a frieze at the Boston Public Library and she was inducted into the National Women's Hall of Fame.



In a large gathering of people, emergencies always arise and the handy banana plant comes to the aid.

The banana plant is of Indian origin and it can grow in a variety of soils. About 60 varieties of bananas are being cultivated in our country. Besides being a popular fruit, the green banana is also used as a vegetable. In fact, the entire banana plant is useful to man. Exotic dishes can be made with the banana stem, flower and fruit.
