The following resolutions were passed at the Extraordinary General Meeting held on Tuesday, February 27, 2001.

1) "RESOLVED to increase the membership of IWA from 275 to 300".

Page 4 of the Constitution - Article III - Rules and Regulations - Clause No.8

At present states

The membership of IWA shall not exceed 275. As far as possible, the membership of IWA will include three Indian members for every Non-Indian member. However, the Board may on the recommendation of the Membership Committee, establish any other necessary composition, taking into consideration the aims and objectives of IWA. The said limit on membership shall cover Active, Outstation and Senior members. At no time shall the number of Outstation members exceed 5 percent of the total membership.

Amended as

The membership of IWA shall not exceed 300. As far as possible, the membership of IWA will include three Indian members for every Non-Indian member. However, the Board may on the recommendation of the Membership Committee, establish any other necessary composition, taking into consideration the aims and objectives of IWA. The said limit on membership shall cover only Active and Temporary members and not include Outstation and Senior Members.

"RESOLVED to exclude Outstation and senior members from the total count of members".

Page 6 of the Constitution - Article III - Rules and Regulations - Clause No.14

At present states

An active member of IWA who has been an active member for atleast five years and who, thereafter, lives outside Chennai, may be classified as an Outstation member, at her request to the Membership Sub-Committee, who will take the decision to forward the application to the Board. She may retain her outstation category for not more than three years, after which her membership will automatically cease.

If she returns to Chennai at any time after three years and reapplies for membership, she may be given preference. If she does not return to Chennai but wishes to continue to receive the IWA newsletter, she may do so on payment of a special subscription amount to be determined by the Board. Outstation members may attend any IWA activity.

Amended as

An active member of IWA who has been an active member for atleast five years and who, thereafter lives outside Chennai, may be classified as an Outstation member, at her request to the Membership Sub-Committee, who will take the decision to forward the application to the Board.

If she returns to Chennai at any time and reapplies for membership, she may be given preference. Outstation members may attend any IWA activity.

Page 6 of the Constitution - Article III - Rules and Regulations - Clause No.16

At present states

An outstation member cannot vote or stand for office.

Amended as

An outstation member cannot vote or stand for office or attend an EGM or AGM.

3) "RESOLVED to create a category of Temporary members".

Page 6 of the Constitution - Article III - Rules and Regulations - Clause No.17

At present states

An outstation member can become an active member within three years by informing the Board.

To be deleted and instead read as

Temporary Members: Creation of a special category of Temporary members for Indians who are in transferable jobs or whose husbands are in transferable jobs. The duration of the membership will be for a period of 3 years only and cannot be renewed. The number of Temporary members shall not exceed 2 percent of the memership as given in Article III, Clause 8. At the end of 3 years, a Temporary member may apply for regular membership and wait her turn.

Temporary members cannot vote, hold office, or attend an EGM or AGM.

4) "RESOLVED to increase the annual subscription from Rs.500/- to Rs.800/-".

The annual subscription for membership has been increased from Rs.500/- to Rs.800/- per annum from April 1st, 2001.



PRESENTATION OF THE WOMAN OF THE YEAR AWARD, 2001

The Woman of the Year Award instituted by Nirmal Mirza, member and Past President, has been awarded in the past to various illustrious personalities for their outstanding contribution in a chosen area. The list of recipients includes Shanthi Ranganathan, M.S. Subbulakshmi, Dr.Sharada Menon, Uma Narayanan, Sheela Rani Chunkath and Qudsia Gandhi, Sarojini Varadappan, Gita Ram, Tara Satyanarayanan, Dr. Vomstein, Rekha Ramachandran, Kiran Majumdar Shaw and Sivasankari.

WOMAN OF THE YEAR, 2001

Category: Conservation and Protection of the Environment

Smt. Menaka Gandhi has been selected as the Woman of the Year, 2001. She had served as the Minister of State (with independent charge) of the Ministry of Environment and Forests in two successive Governments. During her tenure she initiated and piloted legislation on The Wildlife Protection Act and The Public Liability Act for Hazardous Chemicals; negotiated the Montreal Protocol on behalf of the Government of India; set standards for Environmental Protection; designed the Environmental Tribunals of India and the Comparative Testing Scheme for Eco-Friendly products called Eco Mark; notified old buildings as Heritage Sites all over the country and coastal areas as Protected Zones with no buildings within 500 meters of the shoreline; created the National Zoo Authority to oversee and regulate the hundreds of zoos in the country and the Vivisection Regulation Committee to control the use of animals in medical experiments and to stop duplicative testing. She also set up the National and State Animal Welfare Boards in the Environment Ministry which is now the apex governing body for animal welfare.

Smt. Menaka Gandhi has set up and runs People for Animals, India's largest animal welfare organisation. It has a membership of over 2,00,000 and 140 recognised chapters that run programs, shelters, ambulances and other services. Her work and achievements span over two decades - from reforming Delhi's slaughterhouse, banning animal symbols in electoral politics, stopping cruelty to animals in Indian films, banning mini-zoos and bull fighting in Goa, to stopping camels on the beaches.

She has also authored several books two of which are Animal Laws of India, invaluable to lawyers, and First Aid for Animals, the first of its kind.

Today as the Minister of State for Social Justice and Empowerment, Government of India her initiatives include rehabilitation schemes for the old, disabled, mentally handicapped and the drug-addicted.

At Smt. Gandhi's request Nirmal Mirza is presenting her with a cheque for Rs. 10,000/-in the name of People for Animals, and IWA will be presenting a cheque for Rs.10,000/- for the same cause.

Temples and Places - A Dream come true

"Take the time, make the time to do those things you have always wanted to do. After all you deserve it".

I thought this quotation most appropriate for our group of 20 IWA members, who decided to do the Pondicherry, Chidambaram, Thanjavur and Chettinad Trip on February 19.

We assembled bright and early at the Madras Club for the four-day adventure. The bus "Parveen" became a sort of second home to us as we drove along in air-conditioned comfort.

Arriving at Pondicherry, very much on time, we viewed some old colonial houses and had an excellent guide in Mr.Ajit Kojalgee from Intach. The most memorable experience was a tour of the Hotel de L'Orient which after its restoration, managed to capture the magnificence of a bygone era with its colonial furniture and Ravi Varma oleographs. A relaxed lunch at the Rendez Vouz and we were off heading South.

Our next halt was the Nataraja Temple at Chidambaram. At the entrance of the temple sits a Nandi facing towards the Chit Sabha, the hall of the inner sanctum which houses Nataraja, the Lord of the Cosmic Dance and the formless lingam - the element of ether or air - "The Akasha Kshetra". From there on to the Vaitheeswarankoil, dedicated to Shiva and Parvati. It is believed that the worship of Shiva in the temple heals all illnesses.

We spent the night at Swamimalai - The Sterling Resorts Village. It was an ethnic setting with dinner and breakfast cooked and served in mud pots - Kumbakonam has always been famous for its bronze icons and pottery. Some of the most enthusiastic among us got up in the early hours of the morning and had a quick darshan of Lord Muruga on the hill. We also watched the manufacture of bronze icons nearby and even managed some saree shopping in the weavers' colony! Next was a visit to Dharasuram to visit the famous Airatesvara Temple and on to Gangaikonda-cholapuram.

After lunch we left for Thanjavur to the Brihadiswara Temple, and for many of us it was very auspicious as it was Maha Shivarathri. The Brihadiswara Temple built around 1010, dedicated to Lord Shiva, is one of the few temples in India to have a World Heritage listing. One of the largest Nandis in India, created from a single rock, looks towards the main sanctum sanctorum.

Chettinad was next on our map. We enjoyed a sumptuous lunch at Visalakshi's huge mansion and later visited the Palace, the Murugappa family house in Pallathur and Mr.Subbiah Chettiar's family house. Words cannot express the grandeur of these beautiful homes and the way they have been maintained. We also stopped at the Puliyarpatti Temple near Karaikudi and finally halted at the "Bangla" a heritage home fully renovated and restored. It was truly an experience to be at the "Bangla" with all its old world charm.

Next morning saw us shopping for antiques and sarees after visiting the Koviloor Madam, where a Chettiar Swami resides even now. After a great lunch, we proceeded on the last lap of our journey, stopping for a short time to view the family home of Meenakshi Meyappan and Umayal Chettyappan in Karaikudi.

I can only say that the fulfillment of the aims and objectives on which IWA was founded was so evident in this tour. We made new friends and contacts, both Indian and non-Indians, and got to help, know and understand each other better.

Our thanks are due to the organizers of the trip - Visalakshi Ramaswami and Aruna Vijaykumar for the meticulous detail with which they planned and conducted this perfect tour.

We also thank members of the MSMM family, Meenakshi Meyappan, Visalakshi Ramaswamy, Meyammai Murugappan, Umayal Chettyappan, Alagammai Alagappan, Alagu Muthu and Chandrika Chidambaram for their gracious hospitality.
