INSIGHT INTO CORONARY ARTERY DISEASE

The incidence of coronary artery disease in Indians has been steadily increasing since the last two decades and has currently reached epidemic proportions. Common risk factors (traditional) like high cholesterol, smoking, diabetes and hypertension are important contributors in addition to other factors like stress, sedentary life styles, obesity and family history of heart disease. These factors alone do not represent the full story of the epidemic in India. Metabolic risk factors like diabetes, insulin resistance and syndrome X are peculiar to Indians and this may offer some insight into the excessive rates of coronary artery disease which are high compared to the west which has nearly the same total cholesterol levels as our population. Preventive strategies are important for a developing country like ours as it may obviate the need for expensive therapies. These strategies can be implemented only when we understand the nuances of the disease as present in our country.

Dr.C.C. Srinivas will give us an insight into coronary artery disease.
