CHIKANKARI & THE MOGHUL INFLUENCE

Greatly admired as the place in the Indian subcontinent where indigenous etiquette and manners were sculpted in baroque, Lucknow is a place that is still renowned for its gentility, refined manners, unassuming sophistication, love of poetry, wit and literature. It was this spirit that earned the city its nickname: 'The Shiraz of the East'.

Uma Bhargava will trace the history of Chikankari from the Courts of Avadh through to the gradual removal of patronage due to the dwindling power of the Nawabs in the 19th century, to the end of the feudal Zamindari system, and to the current revival in recent times of the dying art of Chikankari.

While growing up in Lucknow as a member of a prominent and influential family, Uma Bhargava was constantly exposed to the savoir faire - the spirit that makes Lucknow.
