



# THE CONSTANT GARDENER by John le Carré

The novel opens in northern Kenya with the gruesome murder of the young and beautiful Tessa Quayle. Her husband sets out on a personal odyssey in pursuit of the killers and their motive, and what he learns makes him not only a suspect among his own colleagues, but a target for his wife's killers.

A master chronicler of the betrayals of ordinary people caught in political conflict, le Carré in this novel portrays the dark side of unbridled capitalism as only he can.

The discussion will be led by Phil Crook, a civil servant who is on leave of absence from the Department for International Development, in order to accompany his wife, Eunice Crook, to Chennai. Eunice, an IWA member, is the Director of the British Council in South India.


