# HISTORY, CULTURE & TOURS

#### TRIP TO MADHYA PRADESH



Its "Off the beaten track", said Geetha Vasudevan, our enthusiastic organiser as she led the group of 22 veterans onto the Meenambakkam tarmac, for the trip to Madhya Pradesh and let me tell you ladies, at some places there wasn't even a track! The flight to Indore via Mumbai was uneventful, but the arrival with garlands, gifts and traditional Indian welcome, certainly was, and a leisurely night was spent at the Taj Residency.

With political mayhem at Dhar, trips to Oon & Bawangaja were cancelled, so there was added fervour for Omkareshwar. The setting of this temple, on layers of volcanic rock, rising in neat slabs above the river, is arresting. The trip across being fraught with danger, slippery rocks, overloaded boat, etc, it needed stern words from the lady at the helm before 2 trips were considered! We jostled our way up with pilgrims, goats, calves, urchins and beggars, and the pious felt the thrill of accomplishment at the sight of the Jyotirlingam. The view was also magnificent. The dhaba lunch that followed, was a first for several members, who had a first hand glimpse of the speed and courtesy of village hospitality.

We went off to Maheshwar of Rani Ahilyabai Holkar, set exquisitely on the banks of the Narmada, with delicately sculpted arches, domes and turrets in its temples and fort. At Ujjain the soaring Mahakaleshwar temple evoked awe and reverence. We had a good darshan and marvelled at the cleanliness in spite of the crowds. The drive to Mandu was trying for even the hardy, and to arrive at a blacked out town was disappointing, but the sunrise next morning changed everything. With the Ship Palaces, the Swing Palace, the Jami Masjid, Roopmati's Pavilion, each more glorious than the last, romance was in the air. Baz Bahadur and Roopmati were lovers of music and each other, and centuries later the calm serenity underscores this.

Sanchi was a haven of peace and beauty, and young or old we climbed in and out of monuments with no thought of life or limb. We saw the ancient Khamb Baba pillar of 2 B.C., and the caves of Udaigiri of later vintage.

Bhopal was the final stop, and lived up to its reputation of State capital - the electricity never failed, the lakes had water, the roads were good; and the ladies had a wonderful chance to shop!

We left by train for Pench, and revelled in the quiet of a forest resort, flowing with Nagpur orange juice, wild honey, and the palas flower, brilliant orange against the dry earth. No; we didn't see a tiger or a bear, but driving through teak forest with sambar, spotted deer, bison, jackal, black-faced langur and innumerable birds, who cares? The trip was the high light.
