Healthcare costs have been climbing worldwide and are a major cause for concern. Doubtless, we live in more secure times (health wise) than at any other time in mankind's history, but the costs that are involved can be beyond the reach of many. India is no exception; in addition it has some peculiarities that are unique to the country.

In this morning's presentation, Dr. Arjun Rajagopal, Chief of Medical Staff, Sundaram Medical Foundation, will take a look at why healthcare has become so expensive and more importantly examine some strategies for controlling costs. 
