The Book: The No.1 Ladies' Detective Agency by Alexander McCall Smith

The No.1 Ladies' Detective Agency is an amusing, intelligent and heart-warming story set in Bostwana in South Africa. The main character, the captivating Precious Ramotswe is the first and only female private detective in her country. This African Miss Marple is the creation of Alexander McCall Smith who was born and educated in Zimbabwe. He became a law professor in Scotland and went to Botswana to set up a law school there. He is currently a Professor of Medical Law at Edinburgh. Director Anthony Minghella (The English Patient) has reportedly brought the film rights for this book.


