### A Cultural Tour of the Bronzes of the Cholas (846-1173 AD)

Bronze images were made to grace the shrines and to be carried in processions during important ceremonies. Some of the world's most superb bronzes produced in the Chola kingdom. were the figures of Siva as Nataraja, Lord of dance. It reached the high point in the tenth century AD.

The Nataraja (c. 1000) at the Naltunai Isvaram Temple at Punjaj. Tamil Nadu for example, depicts the God, in an ideal human form, dancing vigorously within a flaming nimbus, one foot on the demon of ignorance. Exquisitely balanced, yet full of movement, this bronze is a triumph of three-dimensional sculpture and the art of bronze casting.

The Madras Museum of south Indian Bronzes, houses the largest number of priceless original sculptures.

Recently air-conditioned, it offers visitors a rare opportunity to view in comfort the rich heritage of South Indian Bronzes.
