An introductory video of the Japanese Tea Ceremony will be shown followed by an actual tea ceremony given by Members of the Japanese Community in Chennal.



Kaya Taran is set against the backdrop of the two riots that broke out after Prime Minister Indira Gandhi's assasination in Delhi in 1984 and the Godhra carnage in Gujarat in 2002. The film does not frontally engage with either. It is a distanced look at the dilemma of nuturing one's identity in a multicultural society that borders on the volatile.

Kaya Taran is based on the short story "When Big Trees Fall" by N.S. Madhavan and has received favourable reviews in the press. Sashi Kumar, the Director; a print, TV Journalist, a leading TV News Anchor, who has set up a premier institute for Journalism education in the south-east region will be present on the occasion to introduce the film (10.30 to 10.45 a.m.).

"The Bomma Kolu" Navaratri Celebrations

NAVARATRI is the popular festival when Goddesses Durga, Lakhsmi and Saraswathi; signifying valour, wealth and learning, are worshipped. It culminates on the tenth day that is called Vijaya Dasami or Dussehra. It is celebrated in Tamilnadu and Andhra Pradesh as "Bomma Kolu." The traditional format includes keeping dolls, icons and other colourful objects in a tiered format. But over the years, the arrangements have transformed into thematic ones. What is perhaps heartening is despite unbanization and modernization this tradition continues.

Rani Ananth has a collection of dolls that are nearly a 100 years old. This year she opens her house for IWA members to have a look at her collections. She will talk to us on the significance of the festival.


Relationships in the 21st Century
