

An Insight into Flamenco Dance

Flamenco originated in Andaluzian Southern Spain and is more than just a music and dance style, it is the way of life for the Andaluzians.

The Flamenco Art primarily has been passed through generations by the Spanish gypsy patriarchal way of life.

The Baile Flamenco (dance form) expresses through movement all the emotions found in its Cantes (songs). The gestures in traditional Flamenco are not symbolic or storytelling by nature but seek to review the architecture of feelings.

The Flamenco dancer is a musician, a percussionist that makes music with the feet through graceful movements of the whole body.

A presentation of the Flamenco will be by Adriana di Cillo -La Pimienta, 30, The Director, Writer and Choreographer for the Movimento Mudanza.

Allahabad, a city that is famous for being the home of the Nehru family, the Anand Bhawan and Swaraj Bhawan are filled with extremely evocative symbols of India's freedom struggle.
