### TRULY AWESOME CHINA

We were 40 like-minded ladies, 6 gutsy spouses, hell-bent on sight-seeing, shopping and savoring the enigma called China (not forgetting a slice of Malaysia) in a whirlwind tour that lasted 12 days Here are some of the highlights of our 'fantabulous' trip to vibrant, pulsating China...

GUANGZHOU: Our first stop. We embarked on a city tour and were overwhelmed by the brash modernity of the city spiked with high-rises, broad roads, pass overs and beautiful landscaped terrain. The Yue Xiu Park with its 5 Rams sculpture was gigantic and impressive.

GUILIN: The cruise down the Li River that flowed like a jade ribbon through spectacular limestone formations made us feel as though we were entering a Chinese scroll painting. The visit to the Reed Flute Cave of stalagmites took our breath away. The lure of shopping for pearls-all colours made us dizzy with excitement. And to wrap it all up the spell-binding night show with its realistic theatre settings, not forgetting our relaxing body and foot massages!

XIAN: The first glimpse of the ancient City wall, the aweinspiring sight of the 2000 year -old Terracotta Warriors, the walk down the 'real China' alleyways to the Great Mosque, the visit to the Embroidery, Silk, Cloisonne and Jade Centres, the Tang Dynasty show after a superb feast of Dimsun made Xian a favourite! The overnight train ride was an eye-opener... squeakyclean platforms and tracks, plush carpeted interiors, a plasma TV with headphones for each berth, besides being bang on time!

BEIJING: The splendorous Imperial City- the majestic Great Wall and the adrenaline surge to climb it, the grandeur of the Forbidden City, the concrete enormity of the Tiananmen Square, the divinity of the Temple of Heaven, the dragon boat ride at the Summer Palace, the solemn Ming Tombs and at day's end - the Chinese Acrobatic and Opera Show. Not forgetting the Peking Duck with its special Hoisin sauce!

SHANGHAI: The hyper-modern metropolis with 6000 skyscrapers rising over 80 storeys high, the serenity of the Jade Buddha Temple, walking down the Colonial riverfront-the Bund, the hysterical shopping for designer labels and look-alike fakes at bargainable prices, the ride in the Magnet Train, the speed escalating with our heartbeat from 0-430 kms. in 3 minutes, the visit to the ultra-modern Shanghai Museum... and finally the night cruise taking in the breathtakingly beautiful Shanghai skyline capped it all!

All this while being treated to lavish lunches and dinners ending with the ubiquitous watermelon!

24 hours in a day was just not enough for the innovative itinerary with painstaking attention to minutest details put together by Tour Coordinator HC&T Chairperson Thayabae Kakar and Tour Facilitator Premila Jacob. Kudos to them and to the accompanying Presidents Princess and Rathi and to all the ladies (and everhelpful gents) whose camaraderie (not forgetting the plentiful munchies and joyous singing) made this trip both memorable and a whopping success!
