

FROM THE TREASURERS

Welcome to the new 'eco-friendly' IWA year!

Firstly, a reminder to those who have not yet returned their renewal forms and payment, either by cheque for Rs 1100 made payable to 'IWA Chennai' or, in the case of Non-Indian members without an Indian bank account, the cash equivalent.

The closing date for renewals is 30th June 2008.

- No cheques/cash will be accepted without the form, and vice versa
- Those who do not wish to renew their membership, or wish to change it to senior or outstation member, should inform the Membership Treasurer in writing as soon as possible.
- I know many members are familiar with the guidelines, but for those of you who have just joined us, and for those that need clarification, they are as follows:-
- The IWA year commences on April 2008 and culminates on March 31st 2009
- All IWA members must attend a minimum of 10 meetings (see below)
- All activity meetings will commence at 10.15 a.m. Members are requested to sign the attendance registers to record their presence. The attendance will close at 10.45 a.m. and anyone signing in after this time will not be credited with an attendance
- For clarity, members are asked to PRINT their name and code number. The membership code can be found on their monthly newsletter address label
- To keep track of their attendance record members will find an attendance chart will be provided at all activity meetings in the months of September and January
- Members are encouraged to bring guests along but please note that guest attendance is restricted to four meetings per

year for each specific guest attending the same. Please sign in guests on the guest register sheet. The charges are as follows:-

* Home meeting - Rs 50/guest

* Club meeting - Rs 100/guest * Hotel Meeting - As per actuals

I would also like to draw everyone's attention to the amendment to the Bye law as passed at the AGM on 24th April 2008.

Membership can be terminated as follows:-

- * Dues are not paid within the stipulated period
- A member acts in a manner detrimental to the interest of the Society
- Members use IWA to promote their own commercial or business interests
- Members are guilty of offences defined in the Act and Rules
- A member does not attend ten meetings in an IWA calendar year without a valid reason.

Senior members, as always, will be exempted from the 10 meeting rule, but all other members will be expected to comply with this rule which takes effect from the 2008-2009 IWA calendar year.



"Jatayu Moksham" to Tchaikovsky's "Overture to Romeo and Juliet"

Trip to Yercaud August 16th, 17th & 18th



Yercaud lies in the Servarayan or Shevroy range in the Eastern Ghats and derives its name from the lake located at its centre and from two Tamil words, "yerl" meaning lake and "kaadu" meaning forest". David Cockburn discovered Yercaud and his house "The Grange", an imposing castle-like building built in the 1820s, is the oldest one in the town.

The town boasts of the Emerald Lake, the Japanese Garden, the Orchadirum, and the Rose Garden. The famous ninety year old Montfort school with its old world granite and wood architecture is situated here. There is the Servarayan temple, which is the highest point in Yercaud, the Bear caves, the Killiyur falls, the view of Salem and much more.

Robert Clive, the commander of the British forces in India was miserable and homesick when he first came to India. But his frequent trips to Yercaud helped him recover his sanity and saved him from perennial depression. Such is the rejuvenative power of Yercaud!

THINK GREEN!

Planting trees is one of the most important things you can do to save the environment because trees purify the air by releasing oxygen during photosynthesis and absorb dust and pollution. Did you know that it takes 625 square feet surface area of vegetation to produce the daily oxygen required for one person?

Plant trees in your garden. Three mature trees near the house can reduce air-conditioning expenses by almost as much as it costs to run your refrigerator for a year. If your garden is too small for trees, have potted plants and creepers instead for they help to reduce the carbon dioxide we are spewing out into the atmosphere. A lawn does not absorb as much carbon dioxide as plants so, when planning your garden opt for more plants. If you live in an apartment, have a terrace or balcony garden or even window boxes made, not out of wood, but of cement, metal or discarded plastics.

Most environment problems arise out of public apathy. Most people say, "What can I do alone?" One environmentalist's reply is, "We are alone together". So, stand up for the environment. Make saving it a personal commitment.

AMENDMENT TO THE IWA BYE LAWS

The following amendments to the IWA Bye laws were passed as a Special Resolution at the ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING held on Thursday, April 24th at the GRT Convention Centre, 120, Sir Thyagaraja Road, Chennai – 600 017.

IWA Bye laws Page 3, item no. 6 amended to include the following:

Resolved that "meeting" means general meeting / programme / activity organized by IWA which any or all IWA members may attend

Bye law 10H amended to include the following:

Resolved that an Active Member is a member in good standing. An Active Member must attend a minimum of ten meetings in a year. In case of inability to attend the required number of ten meetings a member must inform the Membership Treasurer of the reasons for such inability in writing.

Bye law 10P amended to include the following:

Resolved that a member can be terminated if a member does not attend ten meetings in an IWA calendar year without valid reason.
