Usha Krishna was elected the WCC President. Usha is a Senior Member of the Crafts Council of India and has contributed extensively to the craft sector.

WCC was founded in 1964 by Alleen Osborne Van der Bilt Web € (USA) and Shrimati Kamala Devi Chatopadhaya (India) to provide service to craftsmen. WCC is divided into 5 regions, Africa, Asia € Pacific, Europe, Latin America & North America.

Mrs Usha Krishna will tell us how WCC has, over the decades, aided crafts people around the world, through workshops and various training programs. It has helped revive some of the world's dying crafts.

Sangeet Chopra, Secretary General, WCC will share the crafts of experience with our members with slides of crafts from around the world.

He has won 16 singles and 13 doubles titles during his career and beaten tennis greats like Rod Laver, Bjorn Borg and John McEnroe. He was the captain of the Indian Davis cup team for much of the late 1970s and 1980s, helping India reach the finals in 1974 and 1987.
