Japanese Sushi

Sushi is the most famous Japanese dish outside of Japan, and one of the most popular dishes among the Japanese themselves. In Japan, sushi is usually enjoyed on special occasions, such as a celebration.

Its origins can be traced back to Muromachi Period of 1336-1573 and referred to as Narezushi. This consisted of vinegared rice which was topped with other ingredients mainly seafood and fish.

The more contemporary version known as 'Sushi' was created by Hanay Yohei in the early 18th century and still remains today the most common form in Japan.

The main ingredient, Sushi Rice, along with tofu, seafood and fish makes this cuisine low in fat, high in Protein, Carbohydrates, Vitamins and minerals. In addition it contains relatively high levels of Omega-3 fatty acids.

Chef Peter Tseng who has been with The Park Hotel in Chennai since its inception will be demonstrating the art form that Sushi has become. A solid feature on the menu and its reputation amongst the local Japanese and Korean community are demonstrated when they come in their droves to sample Peter's wonderful creations on a regular basis.



Justice. S. Jagadeesan, former Judge, High Court, Madras, served as the Judge of the Madras High Court from 1994 to 2003.
 Justice.S. Jagadeesan is well known for several landmark judgments on removal of encroachments as well as Public Interest Litigation (PIL).

Justice.S.Jagadeesan will be sharing with us the problems of delays and the reasons behind the accumulation of huge arrears of cases and the new frontiers challenging the capability and way of functioning of the judiciary.

Leela: A Patchwork Life

This autobiography or rather memoir by the actor Leela Naidu a (written with journalist Jerry Pinto) is charming, idiosyncractic and recounted with a deliciously wry humour. As the daughter of Indian scientist Dr Ramaiah Naidu and French journalist Marthe Mange, Leela straddled continents and cultures and grew up in a world full of interesting people and events. She was listed as one of the five most beautiful women in the world by Vogue magazine but she was much more than that - she was the fine - boned haunting face in Hrishikesh Mukherjee's Anuradha, in Merchant-Ivory's The 🚜 Householder and in Shyam Benegal's Trikaal. Jean Renoir taught her acting and Salvador Dali used her as a model for the Madonna. Leela was married to Tikki Oberoi, the mother of twins and divorced before she was twenty. She later married Dom Moraes, was his unpaid secretary, his best friend and, when he was interviewing Indira Gandhi, his translator (interpreting "his mumbling questions")

Leela completed this book shortly before her untimely death in

August 2009.

Padmini Natarajan who will review this book needs no introduction. Writer, poet, actor, director and storyteller she is an active member of IWA.
