



THANJAVUR

A quote shared by one of our fellow travellers: the Panda asks "what is more important, the journey or the destination", to which the Tiny Dragon replies, "the company of course". This is our new normal, everything is better with good friends and good company. One fellow traveller observed that this holiday allowed her to discover where the fountain of youth and laughter was hiding all along, in plain sight. Throw in good dry weather and golden light for all the days which allowed us to enjoy these divine treasures to the fullest.

This tour of our heritage temples and monuments came alive in the voice of **Madhusudanan**, our eminent historian who brought history to life with his insights into the visions of the rulers and patrons who built them for permanent posterity. Each monument unfolded like a pageant in his capable narration and rendering of history.

Srirangam is the oldest and largest temple complex. In order to protect the beautiful idol of Vishnu from invaders, the townsfolk installed a duplicate for raiders to raid and hid the original behind a wall. The Vishnu Moorthy in his regal supine avatar is exquisitely life like. His large eyes speak to you.

The **Thanjavur Big Temple** has a plaque prominently displayed that declares that the king has abolished untouchability and everyone is welcome to enter the temple premises.





THANJAVUR

The ceiling murals in blue indigo in the **Brihadiswara Temple** are exquisite and there are rare images of **Markandeya** clinging on to the Shivaling as well as a beautiful Subramanya on a peacock.

Sitting on the lawns and listening to Madhusudanan sharing his knowledge on **Gangaikondacholapuram** in the soft evening light, will be forever etched in our memories. The movie PS1 made more sense to me after learning about this great king **Rajendra Chola** who annexed kingdoms as far as **Cambodia** and **Sumatra**. He travelled up to the banks of the Ganges in the north and brought water from the holy river.

Darasuram. The carvings on rock have been perfectly preserved here and the symmetrical pillars, facades, gopurams and steps leading up are a treat to the eye. The chariot wheel here is older than the one in the **Sun Temple in Konark**, Orissa.

It was heartening to see that the ASI has protected these monuments and ensured clean surroundings at these archaeological sites.

Manjakkudi is a gem in this area. The dream project of Swami Dayanandaji, has the motto, AIM for SEVA. There are colleges for women up to the post graduate level so they need not travel long distances to attend college. They also have a very successful organic farming unit where 100 year old traditional rice varieties are grown under strict organic farming methods. We savoured a delicious 'yelai saapad' served on banana leaves.





THANJAVUR

Svatma resort was our home for four nights. Extremely comfortable and well staffed.

The visits to the bronze and stone museum in Thanjavur and the **Panchaloha Bronze** idol making place were enjoyed by all. This process of making panchaloha idols is called the lost wax method.

Part of our group also visited the traditional Tanjore painting artists and learnt about the method of creating Tanjore paintings.

Of course the multiple visits to the excellently appointed spa were a bonus.

Mata Annapurneswari **Tehnaz Bahadurji** made sure that every one of the edible items carried by the members were consumed.


